

Supreme Court Rules on Direct Shipping Case

May 16, 2005

In a groundbreaking decision, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that states cannot discriminate and allow wineries within that state to ship wine to consumers unless they also allow out of state wineries to ship directly to consumers.

Despite the ruling, wineries can not ship directly to prohibited states until affected states pass legislation.

Shipping & Legal Regulations

Shipping Methods & Costs

Standard shipping includes costs for third party transit and all product-handling costs. Standard delivery for shipping to most states will arrive within 7 to 10 business days, following credit card authorization. Please see the [*States We Ship To*](#) section for more details. Deliveries are handled by UPS and FedEx based on state availability. All wine shipments require a signature for receipt. Signatures must be obtained by individuals over the age of 21 years. Shipping charges are calculated when you check out.

Unfortunately, we cannot ship to PO Boxes or APO/FPO addresses. Express Shipping is available for specific states. Orders placed by 11:59 pm PST will ship the next business day, pending credit card verification, and should arrive the following business day after the ship date. Express shipping is not available for Saturday or Sunday deliveries. Express shipping for wine is not available in the following states: AL, AZ, DC, GA, NJ, MA, MI.

Emerine Estates does not ship on major holidays and weekends. Additionally, in cases of extreme weather conditions (i.e. heat and/or cold), Emerine Estates reserves the right to delay the release of shipments to ensure the highest quality of products at the time of arrival.

States We ship to

Bottle Limits & Availability

In some instances, state laws regulate product availability and/or wine purchase limitations. Working within state and local laws may prevent our ability to fulfill your order requests.

We are currently ship wine to 36 states. Certain states allow a specific number of bottles per order. a list of bottle limits by state:

Connecticut-25 bottles per person every 60 days

Hawaii-72 bottles per address per year

Idaho-24 bottles per shipment

Illinois-24 bottles per person per year

Iowa-24 bottles per person per month

Louisiana-4 cases per address per year

Minnesota-24 bottles per person per year

Missouri-24 bottles per person per year

Nebraska-12 bottles per person per month

Nevada-144 bottles per person per year

New Hampshire-100 cases per year

New Mexico-24 bottles per person per month

New York-36 cases per person per year

North Carolina-2 cases per person per month

North Dakota-12 bottles per person per month

Oregon-24 bottles per person per month

South Carolina-2 cases per person per month

Texas-15 bottles per person every 30 days

Vermont-12 cases per person

Virginia-2 cases per person per month

West Virginia-2 cases per person per month

Wisconsin-36 bottles per person per year

Wyoming-2 cases per address per year

Local laws prevent us from shipping to certain zip codes in Alaska, Arizona, Connecticut, Florida, New Hampshire, Texas & Vermont.

Florida state law prohibits shipping into the following counties:
Lafayette, Liberty, Madison, Suwannee and Washington
